There are burned out lights in the fellowship hall and some of the light fixtures may need to be replaced.

The railroad ties around the church lot need replacing, or at least 12 of them do.

The roof in part of the fellowship hall needs repair and it may be worth our while to replace the entire IPC roof over the fellowship hall. The Endowment Fund may be utilized to offset this expense. Three roofers have been recommended and we are in the process of contacting them for estimates. The last roof repair was 2005.

Duties/Responsibilities

- Serve as accompanist for the choir as scheduled.
- Serve as pianist for weekly Sunday worship services, Christmas Eve services and other special services, as needed.
- Attend and rehearse with the choir at mid-week and Sunday rehearsals as scheduled.
- Provide solo repertoire in multiple genres for Preludes, Offertories, and

- Postludes for weekly Sunday worship services.
- Attend quarterly planning meetings with the Pastor and Worship Committee and Choir Director.
- Arrange for and coordinate with substitute accompanists when a worship service must be missed due to vacations and other planned absences.
- Participate in annual review of position with Personnel Committee and Chair of Worship Committee.
- In coordination with Christian Education and the Choir Director, will assist with music for the children during Sunday School.

Qualifications

- Knowledge of the piano and ability to play hymns and anthem accompaniments at sight.
- Knowledge of basic music theory, including simple transpositions or harmonizing a melody.
- Knowledge of the Presbyterian Church, matching appropriate music with the themes of the Church Year.
- Ability to work well with others.

In Loving Memory: Arlene Lidbergh-Jasper



Our beloved pianist and sister in faith, Arlene Lidbergh-Jasper, passed away July 13, 2018; she was 81.

Arlene was born August 15, 1936 in Boston, MA to Charles C. and

Dorothy (Harkins) Lidberg. Arlene lived a full and wonderful life surrounded always by family and friends; always planning her next adventure. Arlene's love of the arts ran deep in her blood, having been showered in the arts throughout her life. Her mom a pianist and her dad an accomplished oil painter took her to many plays and shows in Boston and Manhattan.

In 1961 Arlene moved from Boston to Reno NV, married in 1966 and was blessed with her son Jeffrey in 1968. In 1970 Arlene and family moved to Alaska where she started work at the Anchorage Community College (now UAA) where she worked from 1972 to 1980.

Wanting to start a new adventure, Arlene started a new job at the State of Alaska, Department of Health and Social Services

and simultaneously attended Loyola University's religious studies program. Upon leaving her State job in 1990 Arlene attend UAA full time, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts in Music.

Arlene began teaching piano and playing in bands and doing solo gigs. She loved to teach. At one point she had over 40 students, young and old! She played in the After Six Orchestra, and a few jazz groups all here in Anchorage. Later, she learned to play guitar and took vocal lessons from Big Mitch, singing in choir, solo, and with groups at the local markets, at the Alaska State Fair and in the St Pat's Oktoberfest plays. Arlene loved to perform.

In 2015 Arlene started her next adventure, attending the UAA MFA writing program in creative nonfiction, concentrating on writing her memoir. She belonged to numerous writing groups and guilds, and attended many conferences, her favorite being the one held at Tutka Bay.

Arlene loved to travel, some of her favorite places were Homer, Cabo San Lucas, Hawaii, Seattle, Cannon Beach and Haystack Rock, Rockaway Beach and of course Rockport Beach in Massachusetts.

Arlene followed the Boston Red Sox and was able to attend a Red Sox game at Fenway Park in 2007 with her son. Genealogy was another of her interests and she traveled to Paris and to Fontainebleau school to visit where her parents met.

Arlene leaves an indelible mark on Immanuel. It wasn't until 2015 that Arlene became our pianist, but her faith brought her to us long before that, always an active participant in bible studies and Adult Forum. It was only in late April that Arlene held her last recital where her students showed their love for her as their teacher, shining brightly in their playing.

Arlene is survived by her son, Jeff Jasper and wife, Kim, and granddaughter, Robin Jasper, all of Anchorage. *May we carry forward the positivity and love that Arlene spread in her life.*

God bless you Arlene on your new adventure at home with Christ, you will be greatly missed.



Endowment Update

As of the end of last year (2017) the Endowment Fund has risen to \$293,170.13 which lends itself to important discussions and decisions by the three officers of the fund: Mark Anderson, President; Gale Smoke, Secretary; and Rozann Kimpton, Treasurer. The committee attempts to meet once a month, on the second Sunday. But given conflicting meetings and travel of members, usually about seven or eight meetings actually occur in the course of the year. Our most recent meeting was held on September 9th.

In the future, the committee members would like the possibility of giving to Immanuel Presbyterian Church the opportunity for on-line and other methods of giving to the Endowment Fund. The on-line method would be tied to our website. We would also like people to learn about the diversity and More Light nature of the church to be clearly known when people are considering being a donor to the Endowment Fund.

Given the size of the fund, it has been felt that we have now reached a level where we can began using the fund's resources, as long as it is done in a prudent way and consistent with the fund's most recent Investment Policy Statement, approved by the Session. This includes giving 50 percent of the previous year's earnings to Immanuel Presbyterian Church. We also will consider using some of the fund's resources for the need of roof repair for the physical plant. Af-

ter the cost becomes known, we will make a recommendation to the Session. Other significant repairs to our House of Worship could be supported by the fund however we also want to stress that the fund is not a stagnant source of money—it NEEDS TO GROW, so please when giving, please think of the Endowment Fund and leave your legacy.
